

## THE WALTER CUP MAKES THE HOCKEY HALL OF FAME ITS NEW HOME

The Walter Cup officially added to the Hockey Hall of Fame's trophy collection

Hockey Hall Of Fame - Toronto, Ontario, Canada - June 28, 2024

The Professional Women's Hockey League's (PWHL) championship trophy, the Walter Cup, is officially on display at the Hockey Hall of Fame. It will be showcased within the "Women's Hockey – Celebrating Excellence" display along with newly received artifacts from the PWHL's inaugural season. The Walter Cup, created in partnership with global luxury jeweler, Tiffany & Co., weighs 35 pounds, stands 24 inches tall and is over 13 inches wide. The removable base will include the engraved names of each year's winning team. The Walter Cup is named in recognition of the historic commitment made by the Walter family – Mark and Kimbra Walter and their daughter, Samantha, that provided the financial support that launched the PWHL.

Both Masse and Campbell were formally involved in the ceremonial presentation of the Walter Cup after Minnesota won Game 5 on May 29, 2024.
